Basic Overview of BTBL Service

Audio and/or Braille books, magazines, and accessible music materials

- Via download with BARD
- Custom audio cartridges or hardcopy braille through the mail

Over 150,000 books in the collection and counting!


This service is completely <u>FREE</u> to all Michigan residents who qualify!

Braille and Audio Reading Download (BARD)

- Free BARD mobile App available in the Apple and Google Play stores for use on smartphones and tablets.
- 3rd party player compatible, such as Victor Stream.
- Librarians can put books on patron's BARD wish list for download!



Mail Service

Braille and audio books mailed directly to the patron's home <u>for free</u>.

Download on Demand (DoD) audio book system:

- Custom cartridges, no waiting for the other patrons to return a copy
- Multiple books on a single cartridge complete with titles curated for each patron.



eReader

- 20 cell refreshable braille display
- Humanware product
- Books can be downloaded via BARD right to device OR mailed on cartridge
- 2 devices per school account

What's Available?

- Similar in collection to a public library:
 - Fiction Adventure, mysteries, historical fiction, science fiction, etc.
 - Nonfiction Biographies, history, science, religion, war, etc.
 - Print-braille
- Never wait on a hold list for popular books!
- Read as long as you'd like- no late fees!
- NLS collection v. Michigan content
- Clubs, DVDs, Summer Reading, etc.



Application Process

- <u>BTBL application</u> available
 online or in print upon request
- Any version of the application will be accepted as long as the certifying authority section is completely filled out.
- Electronic signatures of certifying authorities now accepted.


