Do I Qualify?

Any Michigan resident is eligible who:

-  has a visual impairment that makes them unable to comfortably read print books, or;
-  has a perceptual or reading disability, such as dyslexia, or;
-  has a physical disability that makes it hard to hold or manipulate a book or to focus or move the eyes as needed to read a print book

Note: You do NOT have to be blind to receive our books. Large print readers and people experiencing a variety of conditions, including diabetes, Parkinson's disease, and cerebral palsy, could all benefit from our library services.

How do I sign up for Library Services?

Simply fill out and return an application for service. This application can be mailed to your home, emailed to you, or is available electronically on our website.

Part of the application process is obtaining a signature of a certifying authority stating that you qualify for service. This is required due to copyright laws that enable us to reproduce books in accessible formats.

How do I Read the Books?



Digital Talking Book Players are supplied to patrons free of charge. Audio Books are then mailed directly to the patron's home on cartridge through the USPS as Free Matter for the Blind.

This simple machine is appropriate for patrons who prefer a low-tech option.



Or download audio books instantly to your smart devices using the free BARD Mobile App supported by NLS. An email address is needed for BARD Services.

Braille readers can also access books in a variety of ways, including hardcopy braille through the mail, or an eReader device which is compatible with both cartridges and BARD downloading.
