# The Efficiency of Duplication on Demand

#### February 11th, 2019 Gutenberg Statistics

- Gutenberg totals: 275 cartridges with 1900 titles, 57% of DB circulation
- ▶ Batch: **42** cartridges, 220 titles.
- ► Turnaround: **165** cartridges, **1271** titles
- Adhoc: **68** cartridges, **409** titles
- Traditional Mail Card DB total:1451 cartridges
- ▶ Total DB Circulation: **3351** Titles


#### March 18th, 2019 Gutenberg Statistics

- Gutenberg totals: **342** cartridges with **2,534** titles, **56%** of DB circulation
- Batch process: 68 cartridges, 452 titles.
- Turnaround: **208** Cartridges **1,626** titles
- Adhoc: 66 Cartridges 456 titles
- Traditional Mail Card DB Total: 1989 Cartridges
- ► Total DB Circulation: **4523** Titles










## Over a dozen volunteers inspect cartridges at LBPH

- In 2018 CLP-LBPH provided meaningful volunteer opportunities to 193 volunteers who worked nearly 13,000 hours
- DoD makes cartridge inspections unnecessary
- DoD creates an immediate need to find new meaningful volunteer opportunities.



2 Volunteers with freshly peeled label sculptures

- 22 volunteers peeled the labels from 2007 cartridge containers in 5 hours
- Group did 401.4 cartridges an hour
- Each Individual peeled 18.24 cartridges per hour
- We have 400,000 cartridge containers equaling 21,929.82 volunteer hours or approximately 2 years of volunteer work.

#### Removing the label from the cartridge

Using a tool with four pins that match the notches in the top surface of the cartridge, pry up the right side of cartridge label. Hold on to this edge of the label and slowly remove the entire label from the cartridge. Doing this slowly will leave less adhesive on the cartridge itself.

Apply the library generic duplication on demand label on the top surface of the cartridge.

#### Cartridge Label Removal tool

NLS does not yet provide a label removal tool, however this can be fashioned simply from a small tube (from a BIC pen) and 'T' pins.


The BIC pen is disassembled and the tube cut in half with a sharp knife (like a Stanley knife). Use a cartridge as a guide to mark the tube at the 4 points to pierce with the T-pins. With care to ensure that the T-Pins are aligned in both planes (all pins must be parallel and on the same plane), push each one into the soft plastic tube. T-Pins are available from stationary stores such as Staples &



#### Container Label Removal

The long edge label, short edge (book number) and belly labels must be removed from the container. The container is made from low density polyethylene and the labels will remove easily once an edge has be pried up. A plastic razor blade is ideal to pry and edge of these labels. Apply the razor blade to a corner of the label, applying a small pressure. The plastic will move slowly under the label. When you have lifted enough of the label to grab with your fingers, pull the label off, taking care not to tear it.



- Circulation software does not calculate title counts on multititled Digital Books added in orders.
- Gutenberg machine replacement and recovery.
- Converting primary machines into secondary machines.
- Durability of printers.
- Gutenberg settings for smaller books pushes larger orders to secondary machines.
