



DB 88270 [Welcome to Night Vale](#) by Joseph Fink


Based on the popular podcast of the same name, this stand-alone novel takes place in an isolated desert town. A stranger gives pawnshop owner Jackie a piece of paper that simply says "King City," leading her and fellow local Diane to search for this mysterious locale. Some strong language. 2015.

DB 116879 [The road to Roswell](#) by Connie Willis

"When level-headed Francie arrives in Roswell, New Mexico, for her college roommate's UFO-themed wedding-complete with a true-believer bridegroom-she can't help but roll her eyes at all the wide-eyed talk of aliens, which obviously don't exist. Imagine her surprise, then, when she is abducted by one. Odder still, her abductor is far from what the popular media have led her to expect, with a body like a tumbleweed and a mass of lightning-fast tentacles. Nor is Francie the only victim of the alien's abduction spree. Before long, he has acquired a charming con man named Wade, a sweet little old lady with a casino addiction, a retiree with a huge RV and a love for old Westerns, and a UFO-chasing



nutjob who is thoroughly convinced the alien intends to probe them and/or take over the planet. But the more Francie gets to know the alien, the more convinced she becomes that he's not an invader. That he's in trouble and she has to help him. Only she doesn't know how-or even what the trouble is. Part alien-abduction adventure, part road trip saga, part romantic comedy, The Road to Roswell is packed full of Men in Black, Elvis impersonators, tourist traps, rattlesnakes, chemtrails, and Close Encounters of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth kind. Can Francie, stuck in a neon green bridesmaid's dress, save the world-and still make it back for the wedding?" -- Provided by publisher. – Unrated. Commercial audiobook.

### **DB 80117 [Monster hunter International; Monster hunter vendetta; Monster hunter alpha: Monster hunter series, books 1-3](#) by Larry Correia**

Books one through three, written between 2009 and 2011, feature a group of creature hunters at a premier eradication company. In Monster Hunter International CPA Owen Zastava Pitt tosses his crazed boss out the window and wakes up in the hospital to an odd job offer. Violence and strong language. 2011.


### **DBC02579 [Fear and loathing in Las Vegas: a savage journey to the heart of the American dream](#) by Hunter S. Thompson**

Hunter S. Thompson's documented drug orgy through Las Vegas written under the pseudonym Raoul Duke, while traveling with his Samoan attorney, Dr. Gonzo, in a souped-up convertible dubbed the "Great Red Shark." On assignment from a sports magazine to cover "the fabulous Mint 400" - a free-for-all- biker's race in the heart of the Nevada desert - the drug-a-delic duo stumbles through Vegas in hallucinatory hopes of finding the American dream. They manage to consume all the drugs stowed in their car and of course, never get the story, but for Thompson to remember and pen

his experiences with such clarity and wit is nothing short of a miracle ; a pop-culture classic, an icon of an era past, and a nugget of pure comedic genius.


**DB 82497 *Serge Storms, 1-4* by Tim Dorsey**

When Vincent Pryce, Boston's most eccentric billionaire, dies, he leaves behind an epic treasure hunt through the city, with clues inspired by his hero, Edgar Allan Poe. Tuesday Mooney is forced out of her shell when she works with a motley crew to join the hunt for Pryce's fortune. Strong language. 2019.




**DB 53845 *The stainless steel rat* by Harry Harrison**

Slippery Jim can rob a bank in any solar system, con a space captain out of his ship, and start or stop a war, whichever pays him more. So when the cops catch him, the only sensible thing to do is make him a policeman on the Special Forces Squad. 1961.

**DB 118263 *Starter villain* by John Scalzi**

"Inheriting your uncle's supervillain business is more complicated than you might think. Particularly when you discover who's running the place. Charlie's life is going nowhere fast. A divorced substitute teacher living with his cat in a house his siblings want to sell, all he wants is to open a pub downtown, if only the bank will approve his loan. Then his long-lost uncle Jake dies and leaves his supervillain business (complete with island volcano lair) to Charlie. But becoming a supervillain



isn't all giant laser death rays and lava pits. Jake had enemies, and now they're coming after Charlie. His uncle might have been a stand-up, old-fashioned kind of villain, but these are the real thing: rich, soulless predators backed by multinational corporations and venture capital. 
**DB 109734 [El libro de la fiebre](#) por Carmen Martín Gaite**

"En 1949, Carmen Martín Gaite sufrió un episodio de fiebres muy altas que la introdujeron en un laberinto de delirios e imágenes oníricas. De aquella experiencia surgió [El libro de la fiebre], un texto poético, surrealista, en el que trataba de rescatar las fugaces visiones que había tenido. Su entusiasmo por publicar lo escrito se tornó desilusión al comprobar que la gente de su entorno no valoraba positivamente su trabajo, y el texto quedó inédito casi en su totalidad, guardado en el «taller de la escritora», como ejemplo de escritura fantástica en ciernes. En 2007, ya fallecida Martín Gaite, vio la luz este primer ensayo suyo, en el que se vislumbran muchos de los temas que la autora salmantina desarrolló en su obra posterior: el simbolismo de objetos y lugares, las difusas fronteras entre el sueño y la realidad, la construcción del yo a través de la memoria, la reflexión sobre la escritura.... Todos estos motivos nos remiten a su mundo narrativo, y permiten al lector incondicional asomarse a los inicios de una de las grandes autoras del siglo XX español." -- Goodreads.

**DB 114816 [La sombra decapitada y otros cuentos](#) por Santiago Porras**

"Los relatos de Santiago Porras bordean algunas temáticas que nos acercan a situaciones extremas y, a veces, inconcebibles. Algunos relatos bordean lo simbólico, como en el caso de "Autoinmolación", el cual nos exige diferentes interpretaciones. 
**DB 33863 *El probador de muñecas* por Edgardo Gonzalez Amer**




#### DB 95077 Sasquatch and aliens, books 1-2 by Charise Mericle Harper

#### DB 92203 The magic school bus inside the human body by Joanna Cole






**DB 95230 *Llama destroys the world* by Jonathan Stutzman**

**DB 38039 *The Stinky Cheese Man and other fairly stupid tales* by Jon Scieszka**





**DB 50907 The bad beginning by Lemony Snicket**


